RECORD OF MINUTES

ANNUAL MEETING OF STOCKHOLDERS FARM CREDIT EAST, ACA MARCH 25, 2019

The Annual Meeting of Farm Credit of East, ACA is a joint meeting for the FLCA and PCA and one set of minutes shall incorporate all actions by the Farm Credit of East, ACA, FLCA and PCA Boards.

The Annual Meeting of Stockholders of Farm Credit East, ACA was held on Monday, March 25, 2019 at the Marriott in Albany, New York. Attached and hereto made part of these minutes is the 2019 Annual Meeting Information Statement sent to stockholders to invite stockholders to this meeting. Copies of the 2019 Annual Meeting Information Statement, 2018 Annual Report, minutes of the 2018 Annual Meeting, and minutes and report of the 2019 Nominating Committee meeting were available.

Call to Order

Chair Matthew Beaton called the Farm Credit East Annual Meeting of the Stockholders to order at 4:00 pm on March 25, 2019.

Chair Beaton welcomed members and guests and stated that the meeting was a joint meeting of Farm Credit East, ACA and its two wholly owned subsidiaries: Farm Credit East, PCA and Farm Credit East, FLCA. He reported that the Annual Meeting Information Statement had been sent to stockholders during the first week of March 2019.

In accordance with the agenda included in the Annual Meeting Information Statement, the meeting provided the opportunity:

- To hear from the 2019 Director Candidates.
- To provide the report of the 2019 Nominating Committee and allow opportunities for nominations from the floor.
- To elect the slate of members and alternates for the 2020 Nominating Committee.
- To approve the Nominating Committee Charter.
- To hear reports from the Board Chair and Chief Executive Officer.
- To recognize the 2019 Pride of Farm Credit East winner.
- To recognize service of 35 and 40-year employees.

Attendance level for the meeting was 264, including members, member family members, guests and employees. With over 150 members present, the necessary quorum was reached.

Alena Gfeller was appointed to act as recording secretary. Chair Beaton was chair of the Business meeting.

Director Candidate Forum

Chair Beaton extended a welcome to the Annual Meeting attendees. He then introduced the members and alternates of the Nominating Committee (2019 and proposed 2020) that were in attendance.

To better inform stockholders about the 2019 Director Candidates, a moderated forum was conducted by Recording Secretary Gfeller to allow each candidate to inform stockholders of their background and interest in serving on the Farm Credit East Board of Directors. Each Candidate was allowed equal time and provided an equal opportunity to address pre-determined questions.

As part of the forum, Recording Secretary Gfeller introduced the nominated Director Candidates:

- For the Eastern Region seeking a 4-year term: Kurt Alstede from Chester, NJ Henry Huntington from Loudon, NH
- For the Eastern Region (Maine Offices) seeking a 4-year term: Thomas Qualey from Sherman, Maine James Robbins from Searsmont, Maine
- For the Central Region, seeking a 4-year term: Laurie Griffen from Stillwater, NY
- For the Western Region for a 4-year term: Peter Call from Batavia, NY David Votypka from Wayland, NY

Following the Candidate Forum, Chair Beaton introduced Mr. Ian Murray for the report of the 2019 Nominating Committee. Mr. Murray reported:

- In accordance with Farm Credit East by-laws, the 2019 Nominating Committee was elected at last year's Annual Meeting.
- Discussions regarding 2019 director candidates were initially held at customer service council meetings in October and November, 2018.
- Regional Nominating Committee conference calls were held on December 7, 2018 to discuss potential candidates.
- Mr. Murray outlined that the Nominating Committee operates independently from the Board and Association management and the committee controls their own process and deliberations.
- The full Nominating Committee met in Albany, New York on January 8, 2019 with 19 branch offices represented.
- The Nominating Committee conducted interviews with nine potential candidates. After discussion and a committee vote, seven candidates were chosen for the four seats.

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- Mr. Murray reported on the efforts to surface at least two (2) candidates for each open seat and explained that the Nominating Committee acted diligently and with best efforts in seeking individuals to run for the Board of Directors.

2020 Nominating Committee

The 2019 Nominating Committee also took action at their meeting on January 8, 2019 to nominate the member-candidates and alternates for the 2020 Nominating Committee. The 2020 Nominating Committee is comprised of 23 member-candidates along with 23 candidates to serve as alternates. This ensures that all branch offices are involved in the nominating process.

Mr. Morton described Mr. Weaver's extensive record of community and volunteer activity. Mr. Weaver addressed the audience and thanked Farm Credit East for the award.

Recognition of Directors Diane Souza and Dan Corey

CEO Lipinski expressed appreciation for the service and contributions of retiring director Daniel Corey, who was not in attendance, but would be recognized at the Presque Isle Customer Meeting in the fall.


Adjournment of the 2019 Farm Credit East Annual Meeting

OVERVIEW OF 2019 DIRECTOR ELECTION

There are four open director seats to be elected for ' four-year terms:

- One from the Eastern Region
- One from the Eastern Region (Maine stockholder)
- One from the Central Region
- One from the Western Region

Farm Credit East's bylaws specify four-year terms with a limit of four consecutive terms. The bylaws require that Farm Credit East's local service area be apportioned into three regions based on voting stockholders being approximately proportionate to the number of elected directors. As of February 1, 2019, voting stockholder numbers were:

At the close of the current election cycle, the Farm Credit East Board will consist of 16 directors: 13 elected directors, one appointed customer director and two appointed outside directors.

Role of the Board of Directors

The Board's duties include:

- Hiring, coaching and ongoing evaluation of the CEO
- Setting overall ACA vision and strategic direction, including approval of the annual business plan
- Assuring safety and soundness through monitoring financial and other reports (This includes working closely with PricewaterhouseCoopers, Farm Credit East's independent auditor.)
- Enacting overall policy guiding day-to-day operations
- For more information on your Board of Directors, please ask your local representative for a copy of *The Role of a Farm Credit East Director*. Also, for a copy of the Board's charter, please see: FarmCreditEast.com/BoardCharter.

2019 Slate of Director Candidates

There are a total of seven candidates seeking election for four seats. The nominating committee conducted an extensive candidate search starting with fall Customer Service Council meetings, followed by regional conference phone calls in December and then a formal meeting in January. Potential qualified candidates were actively solicited for all positions.

Farm Credit East bylaws also provide for the nomination of candidates by petition. An eligible nominee by petition must provide the secretary of the association with the signatures of at least 50 voting members at least 60 calendar days prior to the annual meeting. This information was posted on Farm Credit East's website after the nominating committee met (on January 8, 2019). As of the January 24 deadline, there were no petitions presented. Also, floor nominations will be accepted for eligible candidates at the annual meeting. For additional information on the floor nomination or petition process, please contact General Counsel and Corporate Secretary Alena Gfeller.

ELECTION PROCESS

Voting for directors will be by mail ballot within 10 business days following the annual meeting. Voters must be a stockholder of record as of March 1, 2019.

Candidates are listed by open seat and alphabetically by name. The election polls will close the end of the fifteenth calendar day following the date on which the ballots are mailed to stockholders. The election for each position shall be conducted independently with each voting stockholder given an opportunity to vote for each of the four open positions. A tellers' committee of members will count the votes and declare the winners within five business days of the voting deadline. The candidate receiving the largest number of votes for each position shall be declared elected.
